Obituary

Mr. Wilmer Roscoe Drake was born in Chambers County, AL to the parentage of the late Mr. Stokes and Mrs. Addie Drake on October 7, 1925.

He was drafted into the U.S. Army during WWII as a sniper, tank driver and a cook. He served for four years. He graduated from Chambers County Training School and attended Tuskegee Institute in Tuskegee, Alabama. After school he was united in holy matrimony to Ms. Ramonia Morgan on December 13, 1951. To this union, three children were born.

Mr. Drake started driving the school bus at the age of 15. He served a total of 50 years as a bus driver. Throughout those years, he also drove the tour bus for the 5 Blind Boys of Alabama. He supported their East Alabama and West Georgia tour. For several years, he was the bus driver for the Five Pointers basketball team as well as 35 years with Chambers County school system.

His life was a portrait of service. He was financial secretary and janitor of Cannon Missionary Baptist church. He served as secretary for the International Male Chorus. He was also a volunteer fire fighter for the Hickory Flat and Welch Community. He was a member of the American Legion, the ADC, the NAACP and Iron Sharpen Iron men's fellowship (Calvary's Rock Church, Sierra Vista, AZ)

He was proceeded in death by his wife of 51 years, Mrs. Ramonia Drake; a daughter Mary Howell, and a son Sanders Drake.

He leaves to cherish his memories; a loving daughter SFC (Ret) Reta M Drake of Sierra Vista, AZ and loving son Frederick (Linda) Drake of East Point, GA; four grandchildren, Shelia Howell of Los Angeles, CA, KeJuana Drake of LaGrange, GA, LaToya Drake of New York, NY, and Demetrius Drake of Tuscon, AZ; one great grand daughter, Jasemine Drake of LaGrange, GA; two siblings, Benson (Corrine) Drake of Bessemer, AL and sister Frances Drake of Roanoke, AL, his Arizona Pastor/Son Bishop Andre V.
