A TIME TO BE BORN ...

Lavongia Johnson Smith was born October 19, 1930, in Chambers County, Alabama. She was born to Willie Dee Johnson and Cora Johnson. She was an only child.

A TIME TO PLANT...

Lavongia's family led her at an early age to a personal faith in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior. This decision impacted the remainder of her life. She was a member of the Liberty AME Church at an early age. In her teen and young adult years, she was a member of the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church. Lavongia was educated in the public schools of Chambers County and the Triumph School of Wisdom where she became a certified teacher.

Additionally, she enjoyed playing dominoes, singing, cooking for family, friends, and neighbors as well as helping every one she could.
