Obituary

Mary Lizzie Glaze Staples was born to the parentage of the late John C. and Willee Glaze on January 18, 1928 in Chambers County, AL. She departed this life at Shore Point Villa in Detroit, MI on September 19, 2017. She was 89 years old.

At an early age, she joined the Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church in Wadley, AL. She later met and married her husband, the late John Marvin Staples. To their union, six children were born. Mrs. Staples was known for being a devoted homemaker who took care of her family. She loved working in the yard and quilting.
