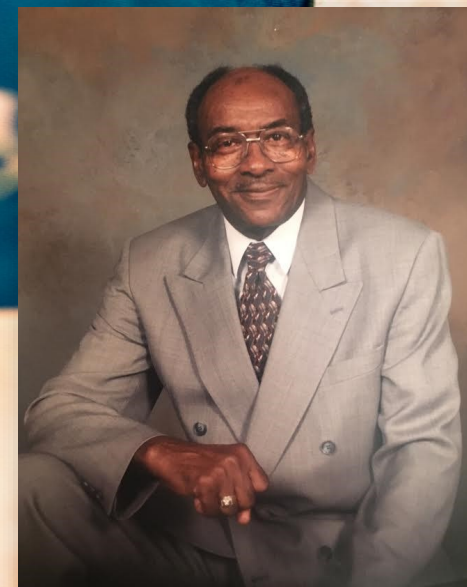

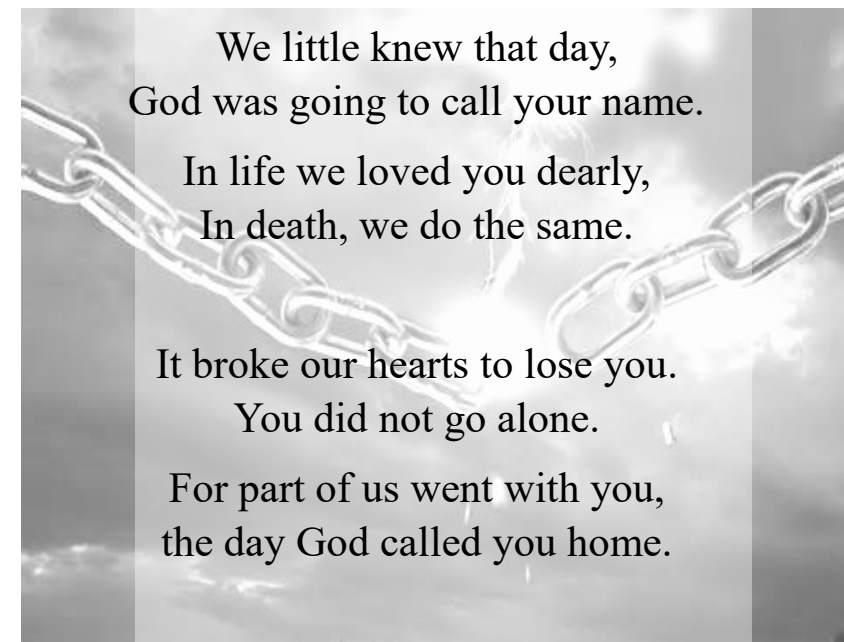
He united in holy matrimony to Pearl McCoy in 1953. She was the love of his life for 63 years.
