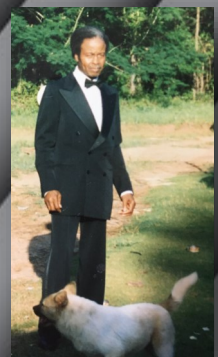
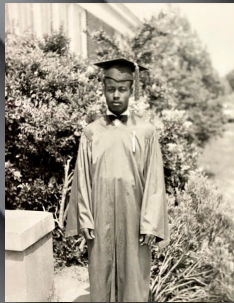

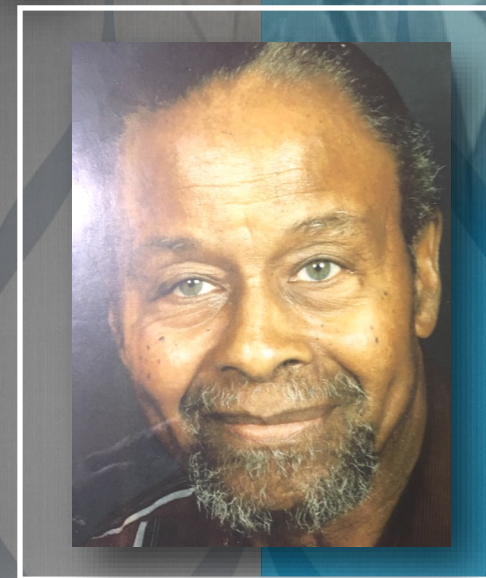

## OBITUARY

James Garfield Huguley was born to the late Amos Huguley and Vannie Izora Reed Huguley on March 27, 1938 in West Point, GA. Those who knew him simply referred to him as Garfield.

Garfield attended Lanier High School in Lanett AL. After graduating, he moved to Brooklyn NY to be near his sister Princetta Mackey, whom he adored. Eventually, Garfield met Betty Mack who he married on July 30, 1960. Five children were born of this union.

For many years, Garfield worked at Nu-Craft Office Supply Co. in Brooklyn, NY as a plant manager. Later on, he relocated to Palmerton, PA to resume his work as plant manager at Vic’s Time Co. until his retirement.

Garfield was an avid church-goer who enjoyed recreation and travel with religious organizations. Throughout his life, he became a parishioner at Greene Avenue Methodist Church and Bushwick United Methodist Church in Brooklyn, NY. He later joined Salem United Methodist Church in Pennsylvania. There, he served as Treasurer, Board Member, and a Summer Youth Advisor.

Even with a demanding job and church obligations, Garfield enjoyed the simpler side of life. He loved the countryside and enjoyed gardening. He grew produce and took pride in sharing his harvest with others. He also enjoyed fishing, nature walks, working with his hands, and doing repairs. Garfield loved sharing pastime stories with his grandchildren, telling jokes, and pulling pranks. He loved music, watching movies, and good ‘ole quality time with family.

Garfield was predeceased by his first son, James Garfield Huguley II, his siblings, Emmie L. Huguley Washington, Princetta Huguley Mackey, Rev. Jimmy C. Huguley, Lester Huguley, Clarence Huguley, Amos Huguley Jr., and Culver Huguley.
